



- Bajaj Auto March sales fall 2% to 2,91,567 units, total sales decline by 9% in FY23
- India auto sales seen rising 7-9% in FY24: Passenger & commercial vehicles to drive demand

Bajaj Auto March sales fall 2% to 2,91,567 units, total sales decline by 9% in FY23

- Total domestic sales grew 47 per cent at 1,86,522 units last month from 1,26,752 in March 2022, as per the filing. Exports declined 38 per cent to 1,05,045 units as compared to 1,70,436 units in the year-ago month.
- Overall two-wheeler sales were at 2,47,002 units as against 2,56,324 units in the same month a year ago, down 4 per cent. Commercial vehicle sales were up 9 per cent at 44,565 units last month, compared to 40,864 units in March 2022 despite exports declining 51 per cent to 10,330 units versus 21,193 units y-o-y in March.
- Bajaj Auto said, in fiscal year 2022-23, its total sales declined 9 per cent to 39,27,857 units from 43,08,433 units in 2021-22, with exports declining by 27 per cent while domestic sales increased by 17 per cent.

India auto sales seen rising 7-9% in FY24: Passenger & commercial vehicles to drive demand

- The Indian auto industry is expected to register sales volume growth of 7-9% in FY24, building on the robust momentum of FY23, according to a report by CareEdge.
- Despite a challenging global environment in FY23, Indian auto companies made the most of the first disruption-free year after the Covid-19 pandemic. Overall, domestic sales rose 21% year-on-year in the 11 months of FY23 when compared to the same period in FY22.
- "Over the long term, opportunities in the electric vehicle market, premiumisation of vehicles, a focus on localisation, improved export potential, and changes in regulatory norms will result in healthy growth for auto component suppliers," ICRA said.
- Sales in the two-wheeler (2W) segment have stagnated in the past three months due to factors like continued price hikes, hot inflation and weakness in rural demand. Bajaj Auto, which depends heavily on exports, also bore the brunt of weakness in key foreign markets like Nigeria. Its exports declined to 45% of its total sales in February 2023, from 52% in January 2022.
